PUBLIC:

MARK WHEATON, 206 Surf Avenue, asked if the City has any idea what the expenses would be to the City if the name were to be changed, and how many line items are on the tax records of the City.

MAYOR ROSENELLO stated that he has been asked that question frequently, and Administrative Assistance Ron Simone has been putting together figures gathered from City Departments. At present the cost looks to be about \$23K. Ron will be updating the figures as more information comes in. There are more than 8,000 line items on the tax records.

JAMES DIPETRILLO, owner of Coliseum Market at 1604 Boardwalk, asked the Wheatons to retract their petition regarding the name change. They are not aware of the losses that DiPetrillo will suffer if the name is changed. Legal action will be taken to stop this question from appearing on the November ballot. The City should have looked at what other cities have done. We do not have enough information on this, especially regarding the costs. There will be costs not only to the City but to property owners also. We should have a compromise. This should be put off for a year until we can get more information. We also should get more input from the business community. Why not use forms such as the ones the Tax Assessor sends out each year. After all the information is gathered we can have a question on the ballot. Legal action will be forthcoming if the question is not removed from the ballot. A fund has been started to get an injunction to get the question removed. The name is the "North Wildwood Name Change Legal Fund." Please contribute. We should all work together.
