
Recently I saw a young man cutting one of our pine trees with a long pole trimmer. The branch he was cutting was well over a foot past the fence line on the Lighthouse side of the fence. I told him that legally he had the right to cut anything extending over his side of the fence line but no further. He apologized and said he wasn't even a member of the family that owned the property. By that time this large branch broke and he further apologized.

Checking out the rest of the trees/ shrubs in the area, it is obvious that there has been recent and frequent cutting and topping of our plant materials on our side of the fence. None of our other bordering neighbors have done this.

You have been warned in the past about this so this letter serves as a **final warning** to stop this unauthorized cutting. If there is any further evidence of this in the future we will take legal action. In the meantime, if any of the damaged plants develop problems or die as a result, we will have them removed and replaced by a professional landscape company at your expense. This could result in a large sum of money due to the mature size of the plants.

As a reminder, the Lighthouse property is owned by the State of New Jersey Dept. of Parks and Forestry. It is also listed on the National & State Registers of Historic places. It is run, operated and managed by the Friends of Hereford Inlet Lighthouse.
