The above resolution was offered by Kane, seconded by Koehler, the roll being called, all voting in the affirmative, the President of Council declared the resolution duly adopted.

MAYOR ROSENELLO explained that the beaches are in bad shape from 2nd to 7th Avenue. The bulkhead has been lengthened to 5th Avenue now, and a new bulkhead is being built around the bike path to protect the storm drain infrastructure under it. NJDEP has given the City a \$6.7 million grant to extend the seawall to 5th Avenue. Army Corps and other permits will be needed. Sand will be back passed from Wildwood through this emergency contract to build up the beach starting at 5th Avenue and moving southward. Some of the sand could migrate northward towards 2nd Avenue. The Federal Government is proposing a revision of the Coastal Barrier Resource Boundaries, which would preclude the use of sand from Hereford Inlet and would impede the Army Corps from maintaining our seawall. A meeting in Washington on May 10 will be attended by Mayor Rosenello and representatives from Avalon and Stone Harbor. The Army Corps actually sides with the coastal communities on this issue. The low bid for this emergency contract was 50% lower than the other bids.

COUNCIL:

COUNCILWOMAN TOLOMEO stated that the Chrissy Tolomeo Walk for Suicide Prevention will be held on April 21.

COUNCILWOMAN BISHOP thanked all for their expressions of sympathy on the passing of her husband.

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CITY CLERK JETT stated that the Lighthouse will be open for a full moon climb on April 30 from 8 to 10 pm. The NJ State Police will be doing painting and other maintenance/improvements at their properties on Central Avenue.

MAYOR ROSENELLO stated that the property at 110 Delaware, where the City demolished the buildings and installed a bulkhead, will shortly be ready for public auction. The City will seek to obtain CAFRA permits prior to the auction to make the property more marketable. All utilities are now disconnected at Heston's gas station and demolition will be completed shortly. A verbal agreement with Mr. Heston has been reached whereby the City would be able to use the property as an extension of Veteran's Park. The Fresh Air Home continues to raise money for improvements, and the City will assist in a DCA Grant application. The Seaport Pier project is moving forward, with the redeveloper hoping to open this season. The redevelopment agreement contains an option to purchase, and appraisals are being done. This property would give a great increase to the City's ratable base, even with a graduated implementation planned.

COUNCILWOMAN TOLOMEO asked about the McDonald's property.

MAYOR ROSENELLO stated that no plans have been submitted for development at present.

COUNCILWOMAN TOLOMEO asked if the Seaport Pier pool would be open year-round.

MAYOR ROSENELLO stated that the building will be insulated for year-round use but the pool is not enclosed.

PUBLIC: None.

On a motion by Koehler, seconded by Kane, that there being no further business before Council, we do now adjourn. Carried. 10:30 AM.
