REPORT (for Council Review):

Ord. XXXX – NJDEP-Mandated Floodplain Management Regulations

ADMINISTRATOR SIMONE stated that NJDEP is proposing that all shore communities adopt these new floodplain regulations, which would require construction permits for all work falling outside the scope of the Uniform Construction Code. These regulations would saddle homeowners with the need to acquire a so-called Floodplain Development Permit for simple things like fixing an existing window and nailing a few replacement shingles to a roof. The costs of these permits would be added and, in the aggregate, used to determine the need to raise the dwelling to current floodplain standards.

CITY CLERK JETT added that this is government overreach at its worst. Municipalities would have to hire new inspectors just to keep up with these State regulations. As it doubtful that the State would pay for these new inspectors, these regulations constitute another unfunded mandate coming from Trenton.
