Please see the attached 2023 beach "No Rake Zone" list for the specific restricted areas with documented threatened and endangered beach nesting shorebird habitat.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 7:7-10.2 (a)4 & (b)6, the NJDEP Division of Land Resource Protection, in conjunction with the NJDEP Division of Fish and Wildlife, has determined that the 2023 CAFRA "No Rake" Zone list includes areas for which you potentially conduct beach and dune maintenance activities pursuant to a coastal general or individual permit. These areas have been documented by the Department as habitat for threatened or endangered beach nesting shorebirds such as Piping Plover (*Charadrius melodus*) and Least Terns (*Sterna albifrons*).

Restrictions:

In these documented areas, the standards at N.J.A.C. 7:7-10.2(a)4 provide that **no beach raking**, other mechanical manipulation of the beach including sand transfers, or use of non-emergency vehicles shall take place between March 15th and August 31st.

This list does not address areas where mechanical sifting and beach raking are precluded because the area is not considered a "recreational beach" in accordance with the standards at N.J.A.C. 7:7-10.2(a)6. This restriction may be waived if the Division of Fish and Wildlife determines that the identified areas do not represent suitable endangered nesting shorebird habitat, due to beach erosion or other causes.

Requests for such a waiver shall include a letter from the Department's Division of Fish and Wildlife indicating that the area is not suitable endangered nesting shorebird habitat, and shall be submitted to the Coastal Permitting Manager, Janet Stewart, Division of Land Resource Protection, PO Box 420, 501 East State Street, Mail Code 501-2A, Trenton, New Jersey 08625.

It should be noted that if you do NOT have a current permit for beach and dune management activities, NO beach and dune maintenance activities (as defined at N.J.A.C. 7:7, Subchapter 10) may take place anywhere on your beach.

Dear Mayor Rosenello:

On March 1, 2023, audited financials of the Cape May County Municipal Utilities Authority ("CMCMUA" and/or "Authority") for the year 2021 were presented to the Board of Commissioners by the CMCMUA's Auditor. The CMCMUA's audit report for 2021 could not be finalized due to a significant delay in the release of financial information, as required under GASB 75, by the State of New Jersey Division of Pension and Benefits. The audit report for 2021 concluded revenues from the sale of 23,111.52 tons of Cape May County generated Single Stream Recyclable Materials exceeded operating expenses associated with processing Cape May County generated Single Stream Recyclable Materials at the CMCMUA's Intermediate Processing Facility ("IPF") by \$1,229,379.98. Therefore, in accordance with the "Shared Services Agreement on Source Separation and Recycling, effective January 1, 2021", between the Authority and Cape May County Municipalities, net positive material revenues will be distributed or credited to each participating Municipality in proportion to the Municipality's share of the total quantity of Single Stream Recyclable Material collected and delivered by the Municipality to the IPF in the year 2021.

In 2021, the CMCMUA received 1,524.95 tons of Single Stream Recyclable Materials from your Municipality; therefore the City of North Wildwood's proportional share of revenues from the sale of Cape May County generated Single Stream Recyclables Materials is \$81,117.25. The CMCMUA acknowledges your Municipality for its recycling efforts and encourages your Municipality to strive to achieve the New Jersey Mandatory Source Separation and Recycling Act and the Cape May County Recycling Plan's municipal solid waste stream diversion rate of at least 50%.

Looking back on the year 2021, the recycling industry faced similar challenges as we all did with increased costs, workforce impacts, and supply chain disruption. However, the recycling industry did have some bright spots which included a rise in commodity pricing tied to pandemic consumption patterns. Certain prices for recyclable materials, such as natural high-density polyethylene (Plastic Resin Code #2), increased to record levels, while the vast majority of recyclable material pricing sustained significant increases over prior year pricing until late autumn of 2021 when recycling material pricing declined sharply.

In closing, please remember these simple Recycle Right guidelines which, in the long-run, make a recycling program a more successful one. **Recycle only empty, clean, and dry loose bottles, jugs, jars, and containers (without lids) and <u>never</u> place recyclables in plastic bags. This application must be fully completed, signed, and forwarded to the Recreation & Tourism Department 90 days in advance of the event date unless waived by the Mayor and/or governing body.

(City Code 382-23) A "special event" is an event sponsored by an organization who desires to use portion of the public streets or other public property, or avail itself of public facilities. Such event must be sponsored by a corporation (nonprofit or for profit), authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey, a nonprofit civic association, a charitable association, a religious association or any other association of persons. Special events shall include, by way of example and not by way of limitation, such events as parades, festivals, craft fairs, art shows, athletic contests, running races, bicycle races, fund raising events and similar events of which may include entertainment.

(City Code 382-24) There shall be an application fee charged to each organization, excluding municipal operations, operating a special event in the sum of \$25.00 for non-profit and \$50.00 for for-profit entities.

All applications will have a 30-day review. Some may require a 14 day and 7 day review prior to their event.

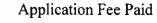

ORDINANCE NO. 1900

AN ORDINANCE TO BE KNOWN AS THE "SALARY ORDINANCE" FIXING AND DETERMINING THE SALARY AND COMPENSATION RANGES TO BE PAID TO THE ELECTIVE AND APPOINTIVE OFFICERS OF THE CITY OF NORTH WILDWOOD, IN THE COUNTY OF CAPE MAY AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY PROVIDING FOR THE RAISING OF THE AMOUNTS THEREOF BY TAXATION AND PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND MEETING OF PAYMENT THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by Members of Council of the City of North Wildwood in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> The salaries and compensation to be paid to the elective and appointive officers and employees of the City of North Wildwood, in the county of Cape May and the State of New Jersey, for the <u>year 2023</u>, shall be within the ranges specified herein; said salary or compensation shall be paid bi-weekly; said amount; shall be audited by the Chief Financial Officer and presented to Mayor and Council for approval.

Section 2. The salary or compensation of any such officer shall be in full for all services performed by them; however, some employees may be entitled to overtime pay as set forth by agreement with City Council. Except as otherwise provided for or excluded under the terms of a collective bargaining agreement or personal services contract, all full-time officers or employees hired prior to March 3, 1998 shall be entitled to longevity pay, based upon a rate of two percent (2%) for each four (4) years of service, to a maximum rate of ten percent (10%) after twenty (20) years of service. Longevity will be paid bi-weekly, and shall be included for pension purposes.

<u>Section 3.</u> Full-time Public Safety Telecommunicators, including Trainees, shall receive a \$350.00 annual clothing allowance to maintain uniform clothing requirements to be paid the first pay in December. All leave (vacation, sick, personal and bereavement) for Public Safety Telecommunicators, as determined by City of North Wildwood ordinances or the Mayor and City Council, shall be converted into hours utilizing an eight (8) hour day. Public Safety Telecommunicators shall also receive an additional one hundred and four (104) hours of paid leave, above and beyond other paid leaves, as a result of their scheduled workweek and work shifts (known as the 42 hour day).

<u>Section 6.</u> All preceding Salary Ordinances are hereby superseded and repealed.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Salary Ordinance" and shall remain in full force and effect unless repealed or amended according to law.

<u>Section 8.</u> This Ordinance shall be in effect upon its final passage and publication as provided by law and shall govern salaries for the <u>vear 2023</u>.

ORDINANCE NO. 1899

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING ORDINANCE 1177, AS AMENDED

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Wildwood, in the County of Cape May and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section One. The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code of

the City of North Wildwood at §276-35A is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read as follows:

A. Lighting. Lighting used to illuminate off-street parking areas shall be arranged to reflect the light away from residential premises & public streets & shall be in accordance with § 276-31. All parking facilities providing five (5) or more parking spaces shall be lighted.

<u>Section Two.</u> The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code of the City of North Wildwood at 276-35B(1)(a) is hereby amended and supplemented so as to

read as follows:

(a) Areas of ingress or egress, loading & unloading areas, parking areas, interior driveways or access aisles & other areas likely to experience heavy traffic shall be paved with not less than six (6) inches of soil aggregate base course prepared & constructed in accordance with City requirements as shown on the Typical Section(s) provided for in the Appendix and any other specifications & amendments thereto.

<u>Section Three.</u> The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code of the City of North Wildwood at §276-35B(2) is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read as follows:

(2) All off-street parking lots providing five (5) or more parking spaces shall have adequate designations to indicate traffic flow & parking spaces.

Section Four. The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code of the City of North Wildwood at §276-35B(3) is hereby amended and supplemented so as to

read as follows:

(3) All required off-street parking spaces shall be nine (9) feet wide by 18 feet long and be located inside the property lines of the property. In the case of residential structures with garage/driveway parking, a minimum of 20 feet from the property line to garage façade is required.

Section Five. The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code of the City of North Wildwood at §276-35B(4) is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read as follows:

(4) All off-street parking & loading areas shall be clearly delineated or shall be provided with either curbing or curb stops so that vehicles cannot be driven onto required perimeter landscaped areas, buffer zones & street rights-of-way and so that each parking & loading area has controlled entrances & exits & drainage control. Curbing or wheel stops shall be located to prevent any part of a vehicle from overhanging internal sidewalks or landscaped areas. Parking & loading spaces shall not be an extension of any street rightof-way. All required off-street parking spaces shall be oriented perpendicular to any street and/or property lines, especially for residential use, except for any parking lot with more than five (5) parking spaces. At no time shall required parking spaces for residential uses be oriented so that parking spaces are parallel to any street and/or property line, except for instances of corner lots where parking may be adjacent to a side property line.

<u>Section Six.</u> The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code of the City of North Wildwood at §276-35E(3) is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read as follows:

(3) Stacked parking, where motor vehicles are parked one in front of the other & require, when fully utilized, the moving of one (1) vehicle to allow the removal of another, is prohibited; except in the instance of residential units where two (2) spaces are provided for a particular dwelling unit. Stacked parking is not permitted within an enclosed garage where vehicles must exit the site by backing out into the street. A car may be stacked in front of the garage if there is a minimum of 20 feet from the garage façade to the property line.

Section Seven. The portion of Ordinance 1177, as amended, that has been codified in the Code

of the City of North Wildwood at §276-35G is hereby amended and supplemented so as to read as follows:

G. Mechanical parking lifts. Mechanical parking lifts shall be prohibited in all zoning districts, other than a lift in a licensed automobile service station, or a lift located within the interior of a residential or commercial garage. Mechanical parking lifts located within a permitted garage shall not count towards the number of off-street parking spaces required by NJ -Residential Site Improvement Standards (NJ-RSIS) {NJAC 5:21-1 *et. seq.*}, City Ordinance or decision of the City Planning Board.

<u>Section Seventeen.</u> If any portion of this Ordinance is determined to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, that determination shall have no effect upon the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall remain valid and operable.

Section Eighteen. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance, to the extent of such inconsistencies only, be and the same hereby are repealed.

<u>Section Nineteen.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the City of North Wildwood that in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:30-7.6a & 7.6b and based upon the Chief Financial Officer's certification, the governing body has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- 1. That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
 - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
 - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
 - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
 - d. Reserve for Uncollected Taxes
 - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
 - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.3 et seq., are fully met (complies with CAP law).
- 3. That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and N.J.A.C. 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
 - a. All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate and correctly stated,
 - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
 - c. In itemization, form, arrangement and content, the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality.
- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced and publicly advertised in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of N.J.S.A. 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- 6. That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution will be forwarded to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services upon adoption.

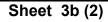

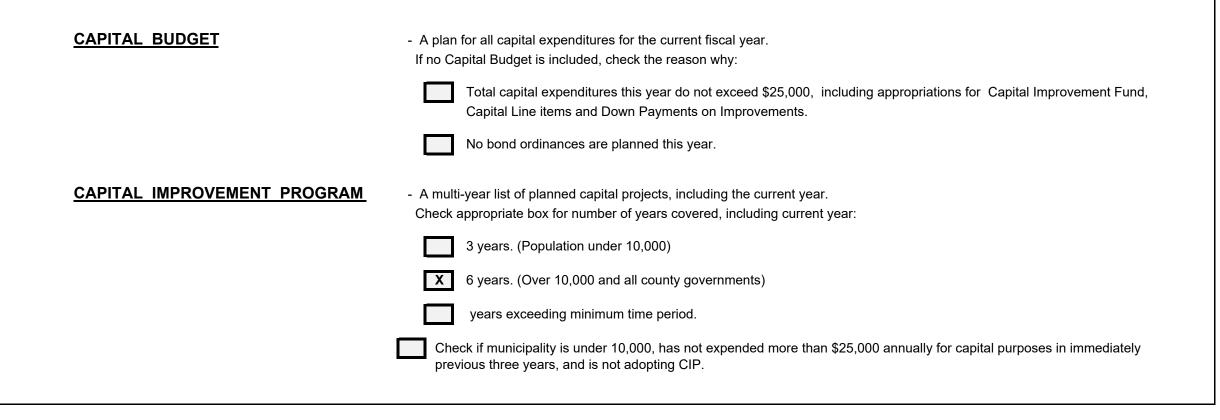

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF WILDWOOD AND THE CITY OF NORTH WILDWOOD

STREET END IMPROVEMENT DESIGN FOR 26TH STREET

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "Agreement") is made on this day of ______, 2023, by and between:

CITY OF WILDWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal offices located at 4400 New Jersey Avenue, Wildwood, New Jersey 08260 (hereafter collectively referred to as the "City"), and

CITY OF NORTH WILDWOOD, a municipal corporation with its principal offices located at 901 Atlantic Avenue, North Wildwood, New Jersey 08260 (hereinafter "North Wildwood").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Morey's Piers ("Morey's") desires to construct a vehicular access tunnel under the boardwalk at 26th street for purposes of providing access to its guests and employees; and

WHEREAS, the City has agreed to provide Morey's with the necessary easements in order for Morey's to construct the access tunnel; and

WHEREAS, as part of construction of the access tunnel, the City and North Wildwood seek to demolish the current ADA access ramp at the street end of 26th street, and to construct an ADA compliant boardwalk access ramp on the seaward side of the boardwalk located at 26th Street; and

WHEREAS, as these services will not only benefit the City but also North Wildwood, the Parties have agreed to enter into this Agreement for the sharing of costs related to the services to be provided by Colliers, as well demolition and rehabilitation costs; and

WHEREAS, Colliers Engineering & Design (hereinafter "Colliers") has provided the City a "Proposal for Professional Services" related to the aforementioned services annexed hereto as <u>EXHIBIT A</u>; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have each duly authorized their proper officials to enter into and execute this Agreement through the accompanying Resolutions.

NOW THEREFORE, with adequate, good and valuable consideration as set forth herein and with the Parties understanding and intending to be bound hereby they hereby agree as follows:

1. <u>Preamble.</u> All of the statements of the preamble are repeated and incorporated herein by this reference thereto as if fully set forth here in verbatim.

2. <u>Term; Termination</u>. This Agreement shall commence upon approval by both parties and terminate ______ (the "Term"). Either party may terminate this Agreement with thirty (30) days written notice to the other party.

3. <u>Scope of Services</u>. A description of the services to be provided by Colliers is set forth on <u>EXHIBIT A</u> annexed hereto.

4. <u>Compensation</u>. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the services provided by Colliers as set forth on <u>EXHIBIT A</u>, shall be shared equally. Furthermore, the Parties hereto shall be equally responsible for any demolition and rehabilitation costs related to the sidewalk, street, and ADA compliance improvements, if any. The Parties also agree to be equally responsible for any miscellaneous fees.

5. <u>Indemnification</u>.

A. To the fullest extent allowed by law, the City agrees to save, defend, indemnify and hold harmless North Wildwood, its elected and appointed officials, its agents, employees and volunteers and others working on behalf of North Wildwood (the "Indemnified Parties") for all claims, losses, expenses and damages, including but not limited to court costs and reasonable attorney fees, which may be asserted against Indemnified Parties arising out of the negligence or the negligent acts of the City, its elected and appointed officials, its agents, employees and volunteers and others working on behalf of the City, with respect to those services in connection with this Agreement.

B. To the fullest extent allowed by law, North Wildwood agrees to save, defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City, its elected and appointed officials, its agents, employees and volunteers and others working on behalf of the City (the "Indemnified Parties") for all claims, losses, expenses and damages, including but not limited to court costs and reasonable attorney fees, which may be asserted against the Indemnified Parties arising out of the negligence or the negligent acts of North Wildwood, its elected and appointed officials, its agents, employees and volunteers and others working on behalf of the North Wildwood, while furnishing services in connection with this agreement.

6. <u>Disputes</u>. In the event of a dispute between the Parties arising out of this Agreement, the Parties agree that they will immediately meet and make a good faith effort to resolve such conflict.

7. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This Agreement represents the entire Agreement between the Parties and may not be changed orally and may only be modified or amended by a written statement signed by all Parties.

8. <u>Jurisdiction</u>. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey, except where superseded by Federal Law.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the parties affix their signatures to this Agreement, intending to be legally bound. If a party is a corporation, this Agreement is signed by its proper corporate officers and its corporate seal is affixed.

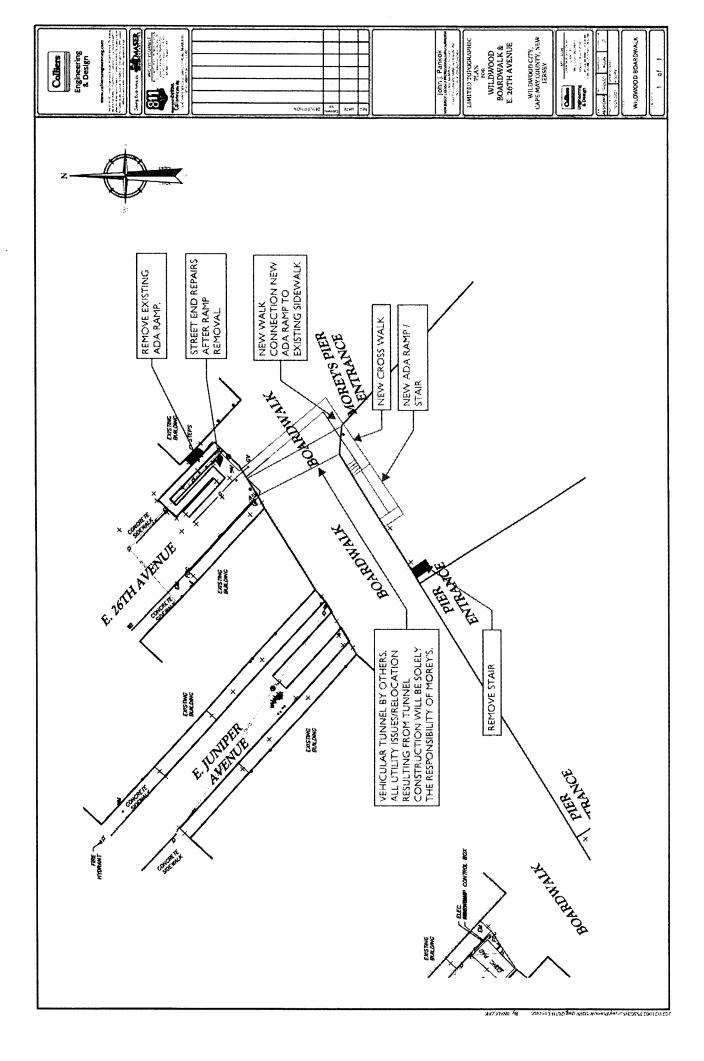

THIS SHARED SERVICES AGREEMENT is made this ____ day of _____, 2023 by and between:

The CITY OF WILDWOOD, a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, with administrative offices located at 4400 New Jersey Avenue, Wildwood, New Jersey 08260;

The CITY OF NORTH WILDWOOD ("North Wildwood"), a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, with administrative offices located at 901 Atlantic Avenue, North Wildwood, New Jersey 08260;

The BOROUGH OF WEST WILDWOOD ("West Wildwood"), a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, with administrative offices located at 701 West Glenwood Avenue, West Wildwood, New Jersey 08260;

The BOROUGH OF WILDWOOD CREST ("Wildwood Crest"), a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey, with administrative offices located at 6101 Pacific Avenue, Wildwood Crest, New Jersey 08260;

Wildwood, North Wildwood, West Wildwood and Wildwood Crest shall collectively be reered to as the "Parties."

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the "Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act", <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:65-1, *et seq.* (the "Act"), authorizes counties and municipalities to enter into an agreement for the exchange of shared services pursuant to the provisions of that statute; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey's Urban Enterprise ("UEZ") Program, enacted in 1983, is in the Department of Community Affairs; and WHEREAS, the UEZ Program exists to foster an economic climate that revitalizes designated urban communities and stimulates their growth by encouraging businesses to develop and create private sector jobs through public and private investment; and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to outline their respective rights and responsibilities and formalize this relationship by entering into a Shared Services Agreement pursuant to the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act of the State of New Jersey.

NOW, THEREFORE, with the foregoing recital paragraphs incorporated herein by this reference and in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound, do hereby adopt and endorse the following agreement:

1. <u>Incorporation of Preamble.</u> All the provisions of the preamble that are set forth above are repeated and incorporated herein by this reference thereto as it set forth at length.

2. <u>Scope of Services</u>.

a. The City of Wildwood, through the Enterprise Zone Coordinator, shall oversee, administer, and coordinate the UEZ Program related activities of the four municipalities comprising the Enterprise Zone Development Corporation of the Wildwoods.

b. The Enterprise Zone Coordinator shall be primarily responsible for all daily operations of the Corporation and the communication and execution of all decisions reached by the Board of Directors.

c. The City of Wildwood shall select and employ such administrative and clerical personnel, including third party consultants, as are needed to carry out the operations and activities of the Corporation.

- d. The Enterprise Zone Coordinator shall:
 - 1. Assist with the identification of activities and projects to be submitted to the NJDCA for the use of Zone Assistance Funds.
 - Participate in meetings and liaise with the State UEZ Office, as necessary.
 - Assist with preparation and development of municipal UEZ project plans, boundary changes, development of the Five Year Plan, and associated tasks.
 - 4. Assist with certifying new UEZ-eligible businesses and recertifying old businesses.

3. <u>Compensation</u>. The Parties shall be obligated to contribute annually to the Urban Enterprise Zone total budget for administration, salary, wages, and other expenses, with 10% of each municipality's Zone Assistance Funds for a fiscal year being the amount

contributed. Any deficits in administrative funds shall be borne by each municipality based upon the percentage contributions to the total administrative budget and any surpluses in administrative funds shall be returned to each municipality for use as Zone Assistance Funds based upon the percentage contributions to the total administrative budget.

4. <u>Method of Payment.</u> Each municipality's annual Zone Assistance Fund allocations for the upcoming year are calculated and distributed by the NJDCA Office of Urban Enterprise Zones following the close of the state fiscal year (June 30th). Following the determination of Zone Assistance Funds for each municipality, the City of Wildwood shall invoice North Wildwood, Wildwood Crest, and West Wildwood for an amount equal to 10% of each municipality's annual Zone Assistance Fund Allocation. Each municipality shall process all invoices for payment upon receipt. Payment must be remitted to City of Wildwood, 4400 New Jersey Avenue, Wildwood, NJ 08260. In the event any party to this agreement does not make the required contribution as set forth herein, the remaining parties will determine whether the non-paying party shall be removed from this Agreement, or if this Agreement shall be terminated, and of no further force or effect.

5. <u>Term.</u> The Term of this Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2023, and shall terminate on December 31, 2025 (the "Initial Term"). Upon the expiration of the Initial Term, this Agreement shall automatically renew for two (2) additional three-year terms (the "Renewal Term"), which shall expire on December 31, 2032, unless any party hereto shall send written notice no less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or a subsequent Renewal Term that they have chosen not to renew this Agreement.

6. <u>Indemnification and Insurance Provisions.</u>

a. The Parties represent that each is insured for liability purposes and agree to remain insured for so long as this Agreement remains in effect. The Parties agree, to the extent possible under the terms of their respective insurance coverages, to name each other as additional insured on such policies of insurances to protect against liability arising from the provision of services under this Agreement, and to maintain such coverages for as long as this Agreement remains in effect.

b. The Parties hereby agree to indemnify, defend and hold the other harmless from any and all claims, demands, liabilities, causes of action, complaints, suits (at law or equity), damages, penalties, fines, judgments, losses, costs and expenses (including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees and costs), arising out of the sole negligence, reckless or intentional conduct of its employees, agents, officers or officials thereof, related to the performance by such Party contemplated by this Agreement.

7. <u>Mutual Cooperation and Performance.</u>

The Parties and its employees, officers, agents and officials acting on its behalf shall, at all times, utilize their best efforts to anticipate and resolve any issues or challenges which arise during this Agreement. All services performed by the Parties shall be done in a professional and workmanlike manner, shall be completed promptly and in an expeditious fashion with no unnecessary delay.

8. <u>Notices.</u> All notice to be provided under this Agreement shall be effective when given in writing and mailed by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the addresses set forth on the first page of this Agreement and to the attention of the respective representatives of the parties as set forth below:

9. <u>Miscellaneous.</u>

a. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Jersey. In the event of a dispute arising out of this Agreement, the parties agree that they immediately will meet and make a good faith effort to resolve said dispute. In the event that the dispute cannot be resolved amicably, then any litigation arising out of this Agreement shall be litigated in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Cape May County.

b. The parties have read this Agreement and it is a full statement of their understandings. This Agreement is not subject to oral modification and may only be changed by a writing approved, adopted and executed with the same formalities as were attendant to the approval, adoption and execution of this Agreement.

c. The headings contained in this Agreement are for reference purposes only and shall not affect the meaning or interpretation of the substantive provisions of this Agreement.

d. The Parites hereto agree that no inference concerning the meaning or interpretation of this Agreement shall be drawn based upon the fact that it was drafted by the City of Wildwood's legal counsel.
