William Etsell was born and raised in Philadelphia and is a Graduate of Mastbaum Vocational-Technical High School. After high school, he enlisted in the United States Coast Guard, attaining Petty Officer Second Class before being honorably discharged. Started Law Enforcement career in 1994 with the North Wildwood Police Department as a SLEO II. Hired in October 1994 by the West Wildwood Police Department. Went to the Cape May County Police Academy, graduating in 1995 earning the academic award and hired by the North Wildwood Police Department full-time in 1997. Assigned to patrol division and became a member of the department’s Special Response Team and assigned to detective division in 2003. He was assigned as the Seasonal Sergeant for the Boardwalk/Bars in the summer of 2007, promoted to Detective Sergeant in 2008 and reassigned to patrol division as a Patrol Sergeant in 2012, to Lieutenant in 2014 and to Captain of Operations in 2021.
